congregation. I do congratulate these brothers who through their first profession officially become members of our congregation. Gratefully I remember the respective novice masters and the novitiate team for preparing these novices for a significant and decisive moment of their religious commitment. I do commend them all to the heavenly intercession of our Blessed Mother and St Kuriakose Elias Chavara.
